This collection of A J Cronin's writings principally comprises literary MSS for some of the novels. It does, however, also contain school exercise books, one dating from Cronin's days at Dumbarton Academy, the other possibly from the short time he spent at St Aloysius' College, Glasgow, and lecture notes from his time as a medical undergraduate at Glasgow University during the Great War. Other writings of a philosophical, autobiographical and miscellaneous nature also feature. The manuscripts are, for the most part, unidentified, and came to the Library in no particular order. Most of the exercise books in which Cronin wrote have now been identified, though a few miscellaneous/unidentified items remain. The collection has been arranged as follows:
