Correspondence, production files and other papers of John McGrath (1935-2002), television writer, playwright, director and film-maker. The bulk of the material dates from ca.1979-1990, though there are some earlier and later items. Much of it concerns McGrath's work outside 7:84, the theatre company which he and others established in 1971.

The arrangement of the collection maintains, as far as possible, the order in which the material was received. John McGrath is referred to as JMcG in the inventory.
