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Papers, 1962-2000, of and relating to Iain Crichton Smith (1928-1998), poet and writer in Gaelic and English.

lain Crichton Smith was born in Glasgow, but his parents were both from the Isle of Lewis and the family moved back there in 1930. Crichton Smith was educated at the Nicholson Institute (Stornoway) and the University of Aberdeen. He was a teacher by profession and taught at schools in Clydebank, Dumbarton and Oban until he retired in 1977 to pursue his writing career. Prolific, both in his native Gaelic and in English, he favoured exploring themes of island culture and religion. Though first and foremost a poet, he also produced novels, short stories, plays and criticism. Sadly for posterity, he did not keep many of his manuscripts; what is here probably amounts to the major archive of lain Crichton Smith.
