Journals, letters, manuscripts, notes, verse, and other papers, 1928-1967, undated, of and relating to Alastair Cram, Lawyer and Judge in Kenya [1909-1994].

Alastair Cram was educated at Perth Academy and Edinburgh University and started his working life as a solicitor in private practice at the Scottish Bar. In the Second World War he saw service with the Royal Regiment of Artillery and SAS during which time he was taken prisoner and was involved in several successful escapes. Alastair Cram was awarded the Military Cross in 1945. In peacetime, he served as a Judge in Kenya and, in 1965, was Governor-General of Malawi. Alastair Cram was also a notable climber, traveller and athlete.

The papers relate largely to Alastair Cram's climbing activities and wartime escapes.
