Minutes, journals, newsletters, visitors' books, correspondence, photographs and printed books, 1839-2010, of St Colm's College.

In October 1894, at George Square, Edinburgh, the Women's Missionary Training Institute of the Free Church of Scotland (FCS) opened to its first three students. The Institute had been founded in recognition by the Women's Foreign Mission Committee of the FCS of the need for a formal period of training prior to overseas appointment. The training that students received during this early period emphasised worship, study, practical service and communal life, with particular focus on educational theory.

Expansion of student numbers meant that it was necessary to commission a larger purpose-built institution at 23 Inverleith Terrace, Edinburgh. The project was supported by the United Free Church of Scotland (UFC, formed in 1900 with the merger of the United Presbyterian Church and Free Church) but funded by private subscription. The Women's Missionary Training Institute was renamed the Women's Missionary College, and opened in 1909.

In the meantime, the Church of Scotland had since 1887 been training women missionaries at its Deaconess House and Missionary Training Institute. Following the union of the UFC with the Church of Scotland in 1929, a similar rapprochement took place between their respective Edinburgh women's missionary training establishments. An overall body was established, known as the Church of Scotland's Women's Missionary College, and the two constituent establishments were renamed; the Women's Missionary College becoming known as St Colm's, and the Deaconess House and Missionary Training Institute becoming known as St Ninian's.

Expansion of the role of the college included the introduction of men's training in 1951. In 1960, a new constitution was approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, and the College's official name became St Colm's College, Church of Scotland. In 1998, this changed to St Colm's International House, housing the Scottish Churches World Exchange programme of international volunteer work and providing accommodation to students from the developing world. In 2010, the Church of Scotland decided to sell the property at 23 Inverleith Row, Edinburgh, and the College closed its doors for the final time.

The archive incorporates records from the institutions of the Free Church, United Free Church and the Church of Scotland, but the bulk relate to what was to become St Colm's at 23 Inverleith Terrace.

Also included are the papers of Effie Gray, student, teacher and lifelong supporter of the college. These were donated to St Colm's in 2002, and were treated by the honorary archivist as a separate series from the main archive; this distinction has been maintained although there is considerable overlap between Effie Gray's papers and the main archive.

A detailed file relating to the gathering together of the archive, including a synopsis of the contents of many of the minute books, can be found in number 188.
