These are principally the papers of David Angus, civil engineer, 1855-1926, covering the whole of his professional career, most of which was spent in South America, in railway and harbour construction and as manager of a large mining company. He also surveyed a railway from Swakopumund to Otavi in Namibia. In addition to technical information on the business and economic history of South America, those papers contain a great deal of personal and private detail of family life there in the late 19th and early 20th century. A detailed curriculum vitae of David Angus will be found in no.7.

The arrangement is as follows:

- 1-2 Letters of David Angus to his wife Mary Wilson. These relate mainly to the period of separation before their marriage while Angus was working on the Victoria and Natividade Railway in Brazil before 1886, and to the times he spent on the survey of the Otavi railway in Namibia, 1892-3, but they include a great deal of information about Angus' other works in the Argentine, Uraguay, Paraguay, and Chile.
