The papers of Francis Collinson, 1898-1985, were given to the Library. They relate mainly to his collection of and researches into British folk-music in general and Scottish traditional music in particular. A small number of papers concern Collinson's work as a conductor of student concerts and revues when he was a student at Edinburgh University and his early professional work in London theatres in the 1920s and '30s.

The collection comprises correspondence, much of it with John Lorne Campbell and Margaret Fay Shaw, notes by Collinson for his publications on Scottish traditional music, copies in manuscript of his compositions or arrangements of folkmusic and press-cuttings and printed matter. There is a set of scripts for the radio broadcasts on British folk-songs on which Collinson collaborated and which he presented in the 1940s and '50s.

In addition there are a few items concerning the life and work of Collinson's father, Dr T H Collinson, Organist and Choirmaster of St Mary's [Episcopal] Cathedral, Edinburgh, 1878-1928.
