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Papers, 1931-1975, of the novelist George Friel (1910-1975), with papers, 1975-1985, of his wife, Isobel, concerning his writing and literary estate.

George Friel was born in Glasgow, and educated at St Mungo's Academy and the University of Glasgow. He worked as a teacher in Glasgow until his retirement in 1973. He published five novels:

Grace and Miss Partridge (London: Calder and Boyars, 1969)
