Additional papers, *ca* 1753-9, 1806, of the family of Cameron, of Fassifern or Fassfern, many being legal papers relating to John, of Fassifern's prosecution and imprisonment for Jacobite activities, 1753-5, resulting in his exile to England for ten years.
