Sermons and related papers, 1826-1884, of William Cowie, minister of Cairnie, Banffshire (1786-1866) and probably of his son-in-law and successor as minister of Cairnie, John Annand (1830-1885).

Rev. William Cowie was born in Banffshire in 1786. He graduated from Aberdeen University in 1806 and became schoolmaster at Mortlach in 1811. In 1817 he became minister of Cabrach and, in 1826, minister of Cairnie. William Cowie was one of the majority of the Strathbogie Presbytery (the Strathbogie Martyrs), suspended in the Marnoch Case in 1839.

John Annand was born in 1830 and graduated from Aberdeen University in 1852. He became schoolmaster at Cairnie and was ordained assistant and successor to William Cowie in 1858. He died in 1885.
